VOTER FRAUD  
North Carolina

Today is the first day of early voting in North Carolina.

My husband and I, both registered Independents, went down to the Wake County (Raleigh) Courthouse to cast our ballots. Our intention was to select judges and a US House of Representative.

At the Courthouse we identified ourselves as Independents. We were each offered one of two ballots: DEMOCRAT or UNAFFILIATED. Those were our only choices. We each selected Unaffiliated.

It was not until I was in the booth and looked at the ballot, I realized there was no opportunity to vote for the REPUBLICAN US House Representatives.

I took my ballot to the Help desk and asked why I was not given the choice of a Republican Ballot. I was told I should have been offered the Republican ballot.

Immediately I asked for the Supervisor.

By this time, my husband who had cast his ballot had reentered the room to discover what was taking so long.

I asked the Supervisor to ask the clerk why I was not offered the Republican Ballot. The Supervisor tried to explain accidents happen, but I was not mollified.

When the Supervisor, my husband and I inquired why we had not been given the offer of a Republican ballot, she first said she did and quickly recanted.

Long story short, I received a new ballot. Because my husband had cast his vote, he received a provisional ballot.

When I left the building, I asked the people outside if anyone worked for the GOP. I informed the volunteer of the situation and my information.

Two hours later, Director Jay N. DeLancy of VOTER INTEGRITY PROJECT contacted me.

After hearing what occurred, Jay decided to go into the same Courthouse and vote.

THE SAME CHOICES WERE OFFERED HIM, by the same clerk. Fortunately, Jay recorded her not offering him a Republican ballot.

Registered voters should not be denied the right to vote.
