I am writing to respond to your question regarding the number of nursing home beds and the number of group home beds, by category, in North Carolina.

Nursing Homes

Per the 2019 State Medical Facilities Plan (SMFP), the nursing care bed inventory (conducted in fall 2018) included a total of 46,210 licensed nursing care beds in operation (45,189 licensed beds in nursing homes + 1,021 licensed beds in hospitals).

Group Homes

The Division of Health Service Regulation (DHSR)-Mental Health Licensure & Certificate Section, regulates several types of residential facilities. However "Group home" is not a formal category of facility for the Section, making the question of *how many group home beds* dependent on the context of the discussion. The following facilities, which serve individuals with mental illness, substance abuse, or developmental disabilities, are sometimes considered a group home:

1. ICF-IID Group Homes: These are facilities that are generally 6 beds or less and are licensed as follows:
 - Supervised Living DD Minor: 18 facilities, 103 beds.
 - Supervised Living DD Adult: 293 facilities, 1916 bed.
2. Residential Treatment Facilities for Children & Adolescents (Residential Level II). 12 beds or less: 38 facilities, 311 beds.
3. Residential Treatment Staff Secure for Children or Adolescents (Residential Level III). 12 beds or less: 145 facilities, 603 beds.
4. Supervised Living for Adults with Mental Illness. 6 beds or less: 226 facilities, 1,322 beds.
5. Supervised Living for Minors with Developmental Disabilities. 6 beds or less: 19 facilities, 75 beds.
6. Supervised Living for Adults with Developmental Disabilities. 6 beds or less: 824 facilities, 4,107 beds.
7. Supervised Living for Minors with Substance Abuse Dependency. Can be greater than 6 beds. Currently 8-29 beds per facility: 7 facilities, 101 beds.
8. Supervised Living for Adults with Substance Abuse Dependency. Can be greater than 6 beds. Currently 6-67 beds per facility: 38 facilities, 590 beds.
9. Supervised Living: Alternative Family Living in a Private Residence for individuals of all disability groups. Can serve 3 or fewer individuals: 369 facilities, 914 beds.

Note: A number of these categories allow facilities with over 6 beds, so it is not clear that all facilities within the category would fit into the concept of a "group home," but that depends on which population the facility is serving and how group home is conceptualized within that context.

Adult Care Homes

A different section of DHSR, the Adult Care Licensure Section (ACLS) regulates adult care homes, a category of assisted living facilities serving older adults and adults with disabilities.

1. Adult Care Home (facilities with 7 or more beds): The 2019 SMFP list 38,326 adult care home beds in licensed adult care homes and 3,041 adult care home beds in licensed nursing homes.
2. Family Care Homes (2-6 beds): 632 family care homes with 3563 beds.
